No. 34 I the undersigned, formerly of Fort Sumter, but for the last ten years a
resident of Charleston in the State of South Carolina, being in the enjoyment of
present good health for my age, as well as in full possession of my faculties of
mind, do this day make my last will as follows: I desire nothing more
to God, imploring his divine Mercy to have mercy on me. Solely my
desire is that my body, should be interred in the year of my death
in the grave yard of the Roman Catholic Church, having been brought up
in the doctrine she teaches, and hoping by the grace of her Son Jesus Christ
of all things to die in the same belief, making also these two testaments
be buried with my own name and that of my wife and daughter
thereon, and that a Mass be said for the repose of my soul. I hereby direct
that my debts should be paid and my widow provided for my widow
time of any death. Fourthly - I give and bequeath to my wife
Dora and to my niece Antoinette Dura the children of Bartholomew Dura
at Lyon in the department of the Rhone in the Kingdom of France, the sum of one
