Assigns to which payment we & truly to be bound I do
bind myself my heirs Executors & Admors firmly by
these presents Sealed with my Seal Dated the
twenty 2th day of August in the 3rd year of his
Majestys sign Anno Domini 1729

is such that if the above bounden Samuel Baker
his heirs Executors Admors or assigns shall or will & truly pay
or cause to be paid to the above named Charles Still
his heirs Executors Admors or Assigns the full
& Just Sum of One hundred & eighty pounds like

the year of our Lord One thousand Seven
hundred & twenty nine without fraud
for their delay then this above obligation to be void
of none Effect or else to be & remain in full force
& Virtue

To Jeremy Wright

We Appointing especial trust & confidence in
you the said Jeremy Wright Do hereby nominate
& constitute & appoint you the said Jeremy Wright
to be Clerk of the Crown and peace in our Province of
South Carolina Giving and Granting
unto you the said Jeremy Wright full power and
authority to do act and execute all such matters &
things as any Clerk of the Crown and peace hath
used to have and of right ought to have in this our
Province to do act and execute And we hereby
further Impowered you the said Jeremy Wright
to take receive & for you all the fees perquisites and
Emoluments which any Clerk of the Crown and peace hath
had or ought to have take receive or enjoy in this our Province

This Commission to continue during pleasure

Bill of Sale by William Anley to Jacob Morris

£ 60 for the Insaling & delivery thereof well and
truly paid by Jacob Morris Indian Trader, The
receipt Whereof I the said Anley acknowledge to be fully
Satisfied and paid Have Bargained sold and
delivered and by these presents have given in and sold bargain
sell and deliver unto the said Jacob Morris his heirs
heirs & assigns and unto their several Heirs Heirs
heirs & assigns all that which the said Anley doth own
have & possess of his and their own proper goods &
 Chattels for ever And I the said William Anley do hereby
promise for my self my heirs Executors and assigns
the said promises unto the said Jacob Morris his heirs
heirs & assigns or a single or all persons shall & will
for ever warrant & defend & make good the aforesaid
promises as the Claim or Claims of any person or persons
whatsoever free and clear and from all manner of
former Gifts Grants for Evidences Claims or Demands
of or to the same by any ways or means whatsoever
