estate both Real and personal, shall go to my Grand Children, children of my
daughter Harriett wife of James English share and share alike and should my
said daughter Ann called Nancy die leaving Issue capable of Inheriting
them, It is my Will that all my Estate I do possess of shall be equally
divided among all my Grandchildren Whom and share alike and with their
