utmost all that come unto God by him seeing he ever liveth to make  
Intercession for them, and who, I trust will not reject me, a returning  
penitent sinner, when I come to him for Mercy, in this Hope and con-  
fidence, I render up my soul with comfort, humbly beseeching the  
most blessed and glorious, Trinity one God most holy, most Merciful  
and gracious, to prepare me for the time of my dissolution, and then to  
take me to himself into that peace and rest, and incomparable Felici-  
city, which he has prepared for all that love and fear his Holy Name,

named Chany, Willie and Frederick. I do constitute this as my request, that all my Stock of both Horses, Cattle and Hogs &c shall be retained in the family for the support of the same, until my youngest child becomes of age. I also request that if my horse named Score Double, should not make four hundred Dollars this year, that I wish him fatten and sent to Kingstree and sold to the highest bidder. I also request and constitute that the above named negroes not be taken from the Estate by any one of the heirs until they become of age, or should marry, until then they will be all kept together as one estate - I also do constitute, M Joshua M White and Hamilton Locklier my son, my Executors of this my last Will and Testament and trustees for my wife and children
