 other Parcel or Package Whatsoever for
 any goods Wares Merchandizes prohibited
 to be imported or exported: Whereof the Customs
 or other Duties have not been duly paid and the
 same to seize to his Majesty's use, And also to
 put in Execution all other the lawful powers
 and authorities for the managing or collecting
 the said duties in all things providing as
 the Law directs Hereby praying and
 requiring all and every his Majesty's
 Officers and Ministers and all others whom
 it may Concern to be aiding and assisting to
 him the said Collector in all things as he
 shall think proper to do and do as he shall
 at the Customhouse London the first
 day of July in the fifth year of the reign of
 our Sovereign Lord King George
 the second Anno Domini 1731

the sixth year of his Majesty's reign
