 I Phelo Peter of the precinct of Laurens and parish
 of St Paul do hereby acknowledge that I have received
 of my son John Williamson the full and just sum of One
 hundred and Ninety pounds Current money of his Province
 in full for three Negro Slaves I have sold to him the said John
 Williamson. Viz One Negro Woman called Diana with
 two Children of the said Diana called Winter and Aster
 and that I will from time to time & at all times hereafter
 confirm the said Diana Winter and Aster
 to the said John Williamson his heirs and assigns and do
 hereby oblig my self my heirs & assigns to the
 perform and observe in Writing whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal this thirteenth day of November 1721
 And in the Eighth year of our Sovereign Lord George by the Grace
 of God King of Great Britain &c. Phelo Peter. C

Letters of Administration to Thomas Holton granted to
 Anne Holton his Widow
 By his Excellency Robert Johnson Esq Captain
 General Governor & Commander in Chief in &c
 over his Majesty's province of South Carolina &c.

To Anne Holton Widow
 Whereas Thomas Holton late of this province Claimant
 & deceased Intestate, having whilst he lived & at the
 time of his death diverse Goods rights & Credits within the province
 & abroad by means whereof the full Dispositive power of grant-
 ing the Administration of all & singular the Goods rights & Credits
 of the said Deceased Thomas Holton has also and being the last
 Calculations & reckonings of the said Administration and
 a final Dismissal of the same to me is manifestly known
 to belong & Desiring that the Goods rights & Credits of the
 said Deceased may be well & truly administered, understood & Disposed
 of I do hereby Grant unto the said Anne Holton in whose
 fidelity in this behalf I very much confide full power by
 the name of these presents to Administer the Goods rights
 & Credits of the said Deceased which to him in his lifetime &
 at the time of his Decease did belong: And to ask & receive
 & receive the same & to pay the debts in which the Deceased
 stood obliged so far forth as the said Goods rights & Credits will
 extend according to the rules & orders of Law, being first shown
 in the holy Evangelists of Christianity to make a true &
 perfect Inventory thereof to be exhibited the same unto the
 Secretary's Office in Charleston in order to be recorded on
 or before the first day of May next ensuing and to
 render a Just & true & full Calculations & reckoning of the said
 Administration When the same shall be required And also to obtain
 a full & singular the Goods rights & Credits of the said Deceased

Day of Charles Town being Enlisted on an Expedition
against some Northern Indians now at Enmity with North Carolina
considering the uncertainty of this life I Declare, Ordain
publish and Declare these presents to be and contain my last
Will and Testament Inprimis I Give Devise and
bequeath unto my Andros Allen of Charles Town in the said
Province of Carolina Merchant all and singular my
Estate real and personal in the said province with which I shall
be seised in any way belonging to me at the time of my decease or
anywise howsoever To have and to hold all and
singular my said Estate real and personal Whatsoever unto
the said Andros Allen his heirs Executors and Assigns for ever
Lastly I make nominate and appoint the said Andros
Allen and his Executors the sole and only Executors of this my last
Will and Testament here by revoking and annulling null and
void all former and other Wills by me heretofore made In wit-
ness thereof I the said Nicholas Day have hereunto set my
hand and seal this 1st day of November
in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred & Eleven
