Declared & pronounced by me the True Property & Purchase of the said Joseph
Hough his heirs & Assigns for Ever all Which I the said Thomas Snowe do for my
self his Cators & Administrators Warrant to Make good & defend against the
claims of all manner of Persons whatsoever Unto the said Hough his heirs &
In Witness whereof the said Thomas Snowe has set my hand & Seal

Before Daniel Green Esq: one of his Majesties Justices assigned to keep
the peace in Berkeley County and Coronner for County Personally appeared
Peter Shepard Pittenger Man who being Duly Sworne on the Holy
Evangelists of Almighty God Declares that on Saturday the 23 instant he came to see
him one Negro Boy named Stampfield belonging to George Bampfield about
a Clock in the forenoon and informed the Depo: that the Wednesday before about
a Clock in the afternoon George Bampfield and Thomas Westhead with several
negroes went out at an Intell about six miles beyond Cape Romare in a Canoe
but that in Going out the said Canoe overset by which means the said George
Bampfield and four negroes were drowned but Thomas Westhead himself
an Indian Name Carolina gott upon the Bottom of the Canoe and Drave
ashore on an Island where he stayed with the Westhead and Indian until
Friday but seeing no hopes of help and no Water nor food to be had he Ventured
out the said Canoe called Alligator Creek to Soc. through the marsh & Creeks
near 12 or fourteen Miles and on Saturday morning he came to this Depo: as
aforesaid who upon this information took a Canoe with Bread & Water
and immediately went to the place of T. Westhead & came there about 3 o Clock
that afternoon and on the arrival found the said Thomas Westhead Stone Dead
in the Creek having brought him a Little Water brought him to
himself and then Dragg a hole to buried the said Thomas Westhead in his
Blanketing from his finger nail ring to out of his Indian Cloth some papers
which he held long and so the wife of the P. Demd Thos^r Westhead
