I know all men by these presents that I John Stevens of
Parish of St. Paul in the County of Colleton & Province
of South Carolina being determined to leave the said pro-
vince in a short space of time Have by these presents made &
constituted & appointed my trusty & loving Servt in law Peter Bennett of the
County & Province aforesaid Planter my trust lawfull power
for me & in my Name & for my use to ask Demand sue for
& recover & receive all such sumes of money &c
Goods Wares & Merchandizes whatsoever whiche
are or shall be due owing payable & belonging to me
Dated from me any manner of ways or where abouts
by any person whatsoever giving & granting unto my said
by these presents my fully whole power strength & author-
ity & all the premises to have use & take all lawfull ways
in my name for the Recovery thereof & upon the receipt
of any such Debts dues or sumes of money aforesaid & any
or other sufficient Discharge for me & in my name to
Recd & Deliver & generally all & every other Act & acts
of Justice in the Law whatsoever needfull & necessary to be done
at the premises for the Recovery of all & every such
or other sume of money aforesaid for me & in my name to
execute & perform as fully largely & amply to all intent
& purposes as I myself might or could do if I was in
present or as if the matter required more speciall authority
than is hereby given & attorney one or more under him
the purpose aforesaid to make & substitute & against all
Persons Ratifying & holding for former Effect
all & whatsoever my said attorney shall lawfully doe in & for
the premises by virtue hereof In witness whereof

Caroline in the County being in good health in body
as of sound & perfect memory thanks be to Almighty God
for the same, & calling to mind the uncertain State of this
transitory life, & that all flesh must yield unto Death, when
it shall please God to call & bring Deceivous to settle things
in order to make this my last will & Testament in manner
of forme following.

I bequeath my soul to Almighty God my maker & to
Jesus Christ my Redeemer & in the holy Ghost my
Sancifier & my Body to the Earth from whence I came

to be Buried in such Christian manner as to my Esq; be thought meet & convenient there to Rest until Soul & Body shall meet again & be joined again. The Joyfull Resurrection & be made partakers of never fading joys of immortality with God in Heaven through the merits of Jesus Christ alone hath beene & prepared for all those that truly & unfeignedly believe in him & trusting such temporall Estate of Mortalities as the Lord has been pleased to give above Deserts to bestow upon me I do order give & bequeath & dispose the same in manner & forme following.

I give & bequeath unto my Dear Daughter Eliz. Valley when she shall attain to the Age of Sixteen years or at the Day of marriage calling my Lands Tenementes Chattels slaves, moveable & unmoveable after the Satisfaction of my Debts & funeral charges be paid &c Item I give unto Ann Valley the Negroe woman Lewis & lastly I do make Constitute or do appoint my trusty & well beloved friend Thos. Perriman to be Ex. of this my last will & testament & to take all into his care & charge until such time that my Daughter Eliz. shall come to the Maturity aforesaid to keep her to school that she may learn what is fit for her bring her up in the fear of God to discharge the charges of her maintenance of the Estate in whatsoeuer place of Heaven unto set my hand, at the Day & year first above written
