To Joseph Lon of Charles Towne Captain.

Whereas William Allison late belonging to his Majesty's Ship Gasland in this Harbour deceased lately Dead Intestate having whilst he lived and at the time of his Death owned Goods Rights and Credits within the Province aforesaid by means whereof the full Disposition and power of granting the Admin of all and Singular the Goods Rights and Credits of the said William Allison deceased and also the Auditing the Accounts Calculations and Forfeitures of the said Admin and a final Discharge of the same to me is manifestly shewn to belong I being that the Goods Rights and Credits of the said Deceased may be well and truly Administered Computed and disposed of I hereby Grant unto the said Joseph Lon (in whose Fidelity in this behalf I have much Confidence) full Power by the Force of these presents to Administer the Goods Rights and Credits of the said Deceased which to him in his last life time and at the time of his Death did belong and to take Collect Every Hereover and Receive the same And to pay the Debt in which the Deceased stood Obligated so far forth as the said Goods Rights and Credits will extend amounting to their rate and Order of Law being first Sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God to make a true and perfect Inventory thereof and to exhibit the same into the Notary's Office in Charles Towne in Order to be Recorded once before the first day of May next ensuing And to render a true and just Account Calculations and Forfeitures of the said Admin when thereunto required And I do Ordain Depute and Constitute you the said Joseph Lon Admin of all and Singular the Goods Rights and Credits of the said Deceased

Goods Rights and Credits of the said deceased
