To Whom this Present Ed. shall come, Greeting Know ye that I, John Bonnin of Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina, do hereby for & in Consideration of the Sum of Forty Pound Court Lawfull Money of the said Province to me in hand Paid by Rich^d Wright, Writor to the State of South Carolina of Charles Town aforesaid Gen^l the Receipt Whereof I, the said John Bonnin do hereby Acknowledge & Charge of & of Every Part thereof to Comerate Acquie & Discharge the said Rich^d Wright his heirs Executors & Admors Every of Them, by these Presents, I the said John Bonnin have & hereafter will, & by these Presents do fully, clearly, and Absolutely bargain & sell unto the said Rich^d Wright his heirs Executors & Admors present & Negro Boy called Cyrus unto the said Rich^d Wright or Desc of the aforesaid Administration; his heirs or Assignes forever more, & the said John Bonnin for my selfe my heirs Executors & Admors do Grant to be unto the said Rich^d Wright his heirs or Assignes by these Presents that at the Time of Insalving & Delivery hereof from the Transfers & Lawfull Owners & Proprietors of the said Negro & having my selfe good right & absolute authority to bargain & sell him or man next aforesaid being free of any Incumbrance what soever; also that I the said John Bonnin my heirs Executors & Admors the aforesaid Negro unto the said Rich^d Wright his heirs Executors & Admors the Claim of any Person or Persons whatsoever shall & will Warrant & Defend by these Presents

Provided always that these Presents are upon this Condition next the selfe that if the said John Bonnin his heirs Executors or Admors any or either of them shall wellfully pay or Cause to be paid to the said Rich^d Wright his heirs or Assignes the full & just sum of forty Pound Court money of the said Province on the Twentieth Day of next next the said Lawfull Interest at said Gen^l Court that then this Present Ed. every Clause Article & thing herein contained herein shall & shall be utterly void to all intents & Purposes any thing herein contained to the contrary thereof in any wise notwithstanding

In the Name of God Amen
William Bennet of Berkeley County in the Province aforesaid Indian Trades-ling Sick & weak of body but Sound & perfect both of Mind and Memory, Praise be given to Almighty God for the same, Calling to Remembrance the uncertain State of this Transitory Life and that all flesh must yield to Death, do make, Ordains, Constitutes and Appoint these Presents to be my Last Will & Testament in manner & form following, that is to say, first & Principally I bequeath my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God my blessed Saviour and Redeemer, Hoping & assuredly believing the Salvation of the same, & my body I Commit to the Earth to be Buried in such Manner as my Executors which are hereafter named, shall think fit, & after all my just Debts and Funerals Charges are fully Satisfied to Paid & my body Interred as aforesaid then as for what Temporall Estate it hath pleased God to bestow upon me, I do hereby give, Devise & Dispose of the same in manner & form hereafter set Down Limited & Expressed

I do hereby Give, Devise & bequeath unto my Loving Wife Mary Bennet my Dear & Loving Daughter, Bennet all my Estate Both Real & Personall, what soever Nature, or Quantity or whatsoever the same may be of, or whatsoever the same may be found To, them and their heirs for Ever Equally to be Divided between them Share & Share alike.

to Lastly I do hereby appoint Mr. James Le Bas & Mr. Charles Holyday my
 Heirs and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament, providing
 and making null & void all other Will and bequest heretofore by me
 made and Declaring this Presents to be only my last Will & Testament
 in Testimony Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Twentieth
 Ninth Day of July Anno Dom 1732.

Whereas the last Will and Testament of W^m.
 Bennett late of this Province dec^d. was on the Seventeenth
 day of August in the Year of our Lord one Thousand Seven
 hundred and thirty two, at Charles Town in the Province
 aforesaid before me the said Governour and Ordinary, proved
 approved and allowed of, the copy of which Will is to these
 presents annexed; the said deceased having whilst he lived
 and at the time of his death, divers goods, rights and credits
 within the said Province: by means whereof the approbatⁿ
 and allowing of his Testament, and the power of granting
 the administration of all and singular his goods, rights &
 credits, and the auditing the accounts, calculations and
 reckonings of the said Administration, and a final
 distribution and discharge from the same to me is manifest
 ly known to belong; And Whereas Charles Holyday
 one of the two Executors in the said Will named is also lately
 deceased, and James Le Bas the other Executor surviving hath
 refused to take upon him the Execution of the said last Will &
 Testament, and, Assuming that the said Goods, rights & credits
 which were of the said William Bennetts dec^d. may be well
 and truly administered, converted and disposed of to persons
 us, DO therefore grant unto you the said Daniel Green (in
 whose fidelity in this behalf I very much confide) full power
