

Letter of Remission to Sam<sup>l</sup> Henderson granted to Mr. W<sup>m</sup> Collins

By the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Arthur Middleton Esq<sup>r</sup> President  
and Commander in Chief in and over his Majesty's  
Provinces of South Carolina and Ordinary of the same.

To William Collins of Charles Town Merchant.

Whereas Samuel Henderson late of this Province Merchant deceased  
died intestate leaving whilst he lived and at the time of his death several  
Rights and Credits within the Province of South Carolina of the said  
said power of granting the Remission of all and singular the Goods Rights and Credits  
the said Samuel Henderson deceased as also the Auditing the Accounts and the  
Honouring of the said Administration and a full Discharge of the said deceased in  
Matters known to be long & demanding that the Goods Rights and Credits of the said  
deceased may be well and truly Administered Granted and Disposed of Do hereby  
unto the said William Collins (in whose fidelity in this behalf I have much Confidence)  
power by the Hon<sup>ble</sup> of these presents to Administer the Goods Rights and Credits of the  
said deceased which to him in his Lifetime and at the time of his Death did  
belong to Ask Collect Levy Recover and Receive the same and to pay the Debt  
which the said deceased stood obliged to pay for the said Goods Rights and Credits  
will be paid according to their rate and Order of Law being first sworn on the Holy  
Evangelists of Almighty God to make a true and perfect Inventory thereof and to  
the same in the Secretary's Office at Charles Town in Order to be Recorded on or before  
the first Day of May now next ensuing And to render a true and true Account  
of the said Administration when thereunto required  
And I Do Ordain Depute and Substitute You the said William Collins Doctor  
of all & singular the Goods Rights and Credits of the said deceased.

Secretary's Office in Charles Town in Order to be Recorded on or before the first Day of  
May next ensuing
