In the name of God Amen I William Hammon of Charles Town, being now weak of Body, but of good true and sound mind do make and Ordain this my Last Will & Testament that is to say - I Give all my Estate real and personal whatso ever I have any Interest or Title in To my dear beloved Wife Elizabeth Hammon To her and her heirs for ever here by making null void any other former Will save this Now published Charleston April the 21 1732

South Carolina By his Excellency the Governor &c 15th May 1732 Personally appeared before me Thomas Burton and Richard Brimston two of the Subscribing Witnesses to the above Instrument Who being duly sworn on the holy Evangelists of Almighty God Declare they were present & did see the above named William Hammon sign Seal publish and Declare the above Instrument to be his Last Will and Testament, and that he was at the same time of sound & disposing mind memory & was not under the least of the Depressions known to the Deeds & Severally subscribed their names as Witnesses together with the other Witness Mary Money Rob^t Johnson

Bill of Sale by James

It now all men by these presents That I James Singer of the Province of South Carolina Cordwainer for and in Consideration of the Sum of Thirty Pounds and Ten Shillings Current money of the said Province to me in hand paid by William Smith of Charles Town in the said Province Treasurer, the Receipt Whereof I do hereby acknowledge and thereof and of every part and parcel thereof do acquit Exonerate and discharge the said William Smith his heirs Executors and Admors for ever I HAVE bargained Sold Let over & delivered and by these Presents in plain & open Market according to the Just and due form of Law in that behalf made & provided DO Bargain Sell Let over & Deliver unto the said William Smith One bright Bay horse named Spring about 5 Irish can hand high mark'd with in the form of a bush on the mounting shoulder and HB on the nearer Buttocks which said Horse was sometime since bought from William Harris of the Province and the said Smith do have and to hold the said Horse and knife unto the said William Smith his heirs Executors & assigns for ever And I the said James Singer do hereby covenant grant and agree to and with the said W^m Smith his Ex^{rs} and Admors that the above sold horse and knife to him or him ag^t his Let and Law full Heirs of all and every person whomsoever my Executors and Admors shall, and with Warrant and for ever defend by these presents In Witness whereof I have here unto Set my hand and Seal this 12th day of Nov^r in the fifth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Second King of Great Britain James
