Bill of Sale from William Brace to James Rousham

South Carolina

To all Christian people to whom these presents shall come
Greeting know ye that I William Brace of Colleton
County in the province of South Carolina for and in Consider
of the sum of five pounds current lawfull money of the sa
Province to me in hand paid before the sealing and deliv
herof by James Rousham of Berkeley County and Province
of Carpenter the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge
and my self therewith fully satisfied and contented and
thereof and of every part and part and parcel thereof
discharge acquitted and discharge the said James Rous
his heirs executors and administrators for ever by these pre
sents have given granted bargained sold aliened conveyed and
confirmed and by these presents do freely fully and
absolutely give grant bargain sell alien convey and
confirm unto the said James Rousham his heirs and A
for ever Sunday last of bought goods vizt one pair of

large iron dogs or and from two spits for roasting meet two
iron pots one large Gridiron with sundry other things
such as shall be hereafter named together with and Indian
whereof named break is also a Lot of land in new London
town in Colleton County as the Plot doth appear together
with all and every singular thing and things as good debts
Chattells and whatsoever. It is my way belonging or appertaining
unto me the said Brace To have and to hold
the said bargained premises to him the said James Rousham to
him and his heirs or assigns for ever to him and their only proper
use benefit and behoof forever and I the said W^m Brace for my
self my heirs heirs and assigns do covenant promise and grant to
and with the said James Rousham his heirs and assigns that
before the sealing hereof that I am the true sole and lawfull owner
of the above bargained premises and am lawfully seized and possessed
of the same in my own proper name as a good perfect absolute
estate of Inheritance I have in my self good right full power
and lawfull authority to grant bargain sell convey and confirm
the said bargained premises in manner as above said and that
the said James Rousham his heirs and assigns shall and may
from time to time and at all times for ever hereafter by virtue
of these presents lawfully peaceably and quietly have hold use
occupy possess and enjoy the said demised and bargained premises
freely and clearly acquitted and discharged from all manner of
former gifts grants bargains sales leases mortgages Incumbrances
or troubles whatsoever and I the said W^m Brace do further
covenant and bind myself my heirs and assigns firmly by
these presents to warrant and defend unto him the said James Rousham
