 Current money of the Province aforesaid to be  
 Paid to the said Gilson Clapp his certain Assign  
 Exec'c' D'm's or Assigns to which payment  
 well and truly to be made and done in ordinary  
 self my heirs Exec'c' & Admir'r & others  
 presents sealed with my Seal & Dated this  
 Sixth day January in the year of our Lord M  
 D<sup>o</sup> C<sup>o</sup>nditio<sup>n</sup> to this obligation is  
 such that if the above bound John Hill his  
 heirs Exec'c' or D'm's shall & do well & truly  
 Pay or cause to be paid to the above named Gilson  
 Clapp his heirs Exec'c' D'm's or Assigns  
 the sum of Five hundred &  
 three pounds fifteen & thillings Current  
 money of the Province aforesaid or upon the  
 first day of February next ensuing without  
 fraud or further delay than this obligation to  
 be void & of no Effect or else to bind and remain  
 in full force power & virtue

Deed of gift by William Maughie Jr. to his Son  
 W<sup>llm</sup> Maughie Junr.

To all Christian people to whom these presents  
 shall come William Maughie Jr. of Charlestown  
 in the Province of South Carolina Salter Sander greeting  
 Knowe that I the said William Maughie Jr.  
 make for the love and affection which I have and  
 bear unto William Maughie Junior of Charlestown  
 in the Province aforesaid also Salter Sander as for diverse  
 other good causes and considerations hereunto  
 moving have given and granted and for myself  
 my heirs executors and d'm's do give and grant  
 unto the said William Maughie Junr. my said son  
 his heirs Executors d'm's and assigns all

my Estate to threat and personal whatsoever then  
I am any ways possessed of, interested in or entitled  
unto within the said Province of South Carolina  
or in any other Province, of what nature, quality or  
condition soever the same may be, Whether the same  
consists of Lands, Tenements, Slaves, household furniture,  
Shop Goods, Saddles, Tools or any other Goods or  
Chattels whatsoever, pertaining & any wise  
belonging unto the said William Macgill Senior  
in whose hands Custody and keeping ever the  
same may be in the said Province of South Carolina  
or elsewhere & to have, hold use and disposed  
of, possess and enjoy the same unto my said Son  
William Macgill Junr his heirs & executors  
as long as he lives, without any manner of claim  
Challenge or demand whatsoever, by any person  
or persons whomsoever, excepting nevertheless  
and it is the true Intent & meaning of these presents  
that the said William Macgill Junr my said Son  
shall and is hereby obliged to maintain the said  
William Macgill Junr in me and Dr. Wm. Wadley  
lodging & apparel during the Term of my life  
agreeable to an Obligation under this hand and  
Seal to me bearing even date with these presents  
relation being therewhile had may more fully appear  
And I the said William Macgill Senior the above  
bargained premises to the said William Macgill  
Junr his heirs executors & assigns doth and  
will warrant & forever defend by these presents  
In Writing Whereof I have hereunto set  
my hand and seal this 18<sup>th</sup> day of March in the  
fifth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George  
the Second by the Grace of God of Great Britain
