

Know all men by these presents that I William Moore of the Province of S^c Carolina Indian Trader for in the Consideration of the Sum of One Thousand and Five hundred pounds current money of the Province some in hand paid by Thomas Binford and James Omond of Charles Town in the Province aforesaid Merchants, at and before the Sealing and Delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have Granted Bargained Sold Assigned and conveyed and by these presents Do Grant Bargained Sold assign and set over unto the said Thomas Binford and James Omond four Negro Slaves commonly called otherwise by the name of Cudj, Jack, Sam, and Jemmy Clasp knife To have and to hold the said four Slaves and Clasp knife unto the said Thomas Binford and James Omond their Executors Administrators and Assigns forever as their own proper Goods and Chattels PROVIDED always and these presents are upon this Condition, Nevertheless that if the said William Moore his Executors Administrators or Assigns shall pay or cause to be paid unto the said Thomas Binford and James Omond the said sum of One Thousand and Five hundred pounds with lawful interest for the same on the Eighteenth Day of this Present month of July then these presents to be void of none Effect And the said William Moore for my self my Executors and Administrators do hereby Covenant and promise and agree to and with the said Thomas Binford and James Omond their Executors Administrators and Assigns that he and may be lawfully for them or either of them at any time hereafter to Take and take possession of the said four Slaves And if the said William Moore for the Consideration aforesaid hereby Assign and set over unto the said Thomas Binford and James Omond all my Right Title and interest of what kind so the three several Covenants or Obligations are made of hand particularly mentioned That is to say one bond of obligation dated the eighth day of June One thousand Seven hundred

and the said Thomas Binford and James Omond being bound in the quantity of Four hundred weight of good heavy Drest Merchantable Dye Shins One other Bond of the said Thomas Binford and James Omond of the same Date wherein they are bound unto the said William Moore and the said Thomas Brown in the quantity of Three thousand four hundred and Eighty eight weight of good heavy Drest Merchantable Dye Shins One other Bond of the said John Stacy and Joseph Griffin of the same Date wherein they are bound unto the said William Moore and the said Thomas Brown in the sum of One hundred and thirty seven pounds current money of the Province aforesaid and one other Bond by the said John Stacy promised to pay unto the said William Moore and the said Thomas Brown the quantity of Four hundred and Sixty five weight of good heavy Drest Merchantable Dye Shins Dated the Twentieth Day of June One thousand Seven hundred and twenty nine And the said William Moore do hereby give unto the said Thomas Binford and James Omond full power and authority to their own proper use and behoof to receive the said sum of money and to discharge the said several Bonds for which purpose he herewith Set my hand and seal the Ninth Day of July Anno Domini 1731
