at eight o'clock in the morning I Remain Marie Dautherive, wishing to let
my Last Will be known and have it positively expressed before my death
which I do not think very distant, not only to my friends but yet to all those
it may concern. Do declare to transfer Surrogate all my affairs and finally
to put in my place my Cousin Charles Auguste just twenty two years of
age whose intelligence activity and wisdom are known to me, for him to
prosecute by all possible means, when and wherever it may be necessary the
termination of the Law Suits which concern or will concern my constituents
or myself and particularly my Law Suit at the Court of Columbia, and
to this End constitute my attorney or all attorneys that he shall think neces-
sary, or agree if he should prefer it with him or those already appointed
to receive all Sums resulting from the conclusion of said Law Suits already
pending or to be entered before any Court in the United States to settle all
accounts and in general do every thing the Interest of my family will
require or may hereafter require. In order to give to my Cousin an un-
equivocal proof of my gratitude for the Care attention and Good he has
constantly shown me since his arrival during my long sufferings I give him
the two hundred and fifty Dollars which I have lent to Mr. Simpson
