N. 33. In the Name of God Amen, I Adam Ewing
of Charleston South Carolina Merchant be-
ing about to leave this State in the Ship Fed-
eralists for London, think proper to make this
my last Will and Testament in manner fol-
lowing that is to say, I give and bequeath to
my Wife Jane, all the money goods, wares or
chattells that I may or have any right to as
coming to me from her Father and Mother
Estates to her own seperate use and disposal,
and when she shall be dead the fifteenth day
of March last entered into an agreement
with Robert Ewing as Attorney for his Bro-
ther Walter Ewing Macclai of Glasgow, whereby
he engages to pay my heirs, Executors, Adm^r &c
for my share interest and title in the concern
of Walter Ewing & Co. of Glasgow and Robert
and Adam Ewing of Charleston, in the event
of my death before my return to Carolina
the sum of three thousand six hundred and
eighty three pounds fourteen shillings sterling
money of Great Britain with lawful Interest
from the first day of July last as by the said
agreement herein inclosed will more fully ap-
pear. now my Will is that the said sum shall
be kept entire and undiminshed until such
time as my Children Robert, Jane, Agness,

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5. Margaret, Elizabeth, and any Child or Children my said Wife may now be pregnant with, shall respectively attain the ages of twenty one years or be married, and that the Interest accruing annually on said sum (excepting twenty pounds sterling to be paid annually to my dear and respected Mother during her natural life, and ten pounds sterling yearly unto each of my dear Sisters Margaret and Elizabeth, after my said Mothers death, if they or either of them should survive her, and be unmarried or Widows) shall be paid unto my said Wife Jane, for the purpose of her maintainance, and the maintainance and Education of my Children, and that on any of my said Children attaining the age of twenty one years or being married they shall be entitled to receive their share of the said sum of three thousand six hundred and eighty three pounds fourteen shillings sterling aforesaid, according to the number that may be then alive, share and share alike, they securing to my said Wife the Interest of their said share during her life if she demands it, I also give and bequeath any other property or properties I may be possessed of at the time of my death, to be added to the said sum as a capital and to be divided as aforesaid and lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my dear friend Robert Ewing of Charleston my brother James Ewing of Greenock and my

ed, sealed, published, and declared as such before
