Item I give and bequeath my Certificate of the United States Loan office bearing an Interest of three per Cent and amounting in principal to three thousand five hundred and thirty six dollars to the chairman of the Vestry of "The Protestant Episcopal Church of Saint Paul in Radcliffborough" and his Successors in office forever, in Trust nevertheless that he and they will during the joint lives of my Gt nces Selma and Cecilia Lewis and the life of the Survivor of them retain out of the Interest of the said sum in behalf of the said Church, all such assessments as may be imposed on & due by my Par M 35 in said Church and pay unto the said Selma and Cecilia Lewis equally between them during their joint lives and to the Survivor of them during her life the balance of the Interest of the said sum of Three thousand five hundred and thirty six Dollars the principal for their and her own use and behoof, and funds and after the death of the Survivor of them, then in trust that he and they will receive and apply

give and bequeath the Residue of my said free Shares in the State Bank
after payment of my Debts which are but small, and the Expence and
provision of manumitting from Slavery my said Servant Jupiter unto
my Brother in Law the Rev^d Dr. William Percy as a token of my Respec-
tance, his Executors Administrators and assigns. Item whereas I have
already given a Deed of Gift for my mulatto boy Benjamin to my Eldest
Son Percy Lewis who is in England but the said Slave is still
in my possession. And whereas I have also given a Deed of Gift for
my black boy Stephen to my Niece Harriet Percy but the said Slave
is still in my possession. I do therefore hereby confirm the said Deeds
and give to each of them respectively the said Slaves as given by Deed

to him and her his and her Executors Administrators and assigns. Item
the Rest and Residue of my Estate Real and Personal whatsoever and

their heirs Executors Administrators and assigns forever as Tenants in
Common. Lastly I nominate and appoint my friends Col. Lewis
Morris and Mr Thomas Parker the Elder Executors of this my last Will
and Testament hereby revoking all others by me heretofore made. In
