Hanit M. Penry P. and G. Peay the first & second

the six children of my late Sister Catherine Elliott Percy that is to say  
Ann & Joseph Elias & Turnbull Selina & Lewis Sophia & Bernard  
Harriet & Percy Bernard & Percy their Executors Administrators & assigns  
as tenants in common provided that if one or more of them should die  
before me leaving any child or children living in such case the share or shares  
of the one or more so dying shall go to his her or their respective child or  
children this Executors Administrators and assigns of more than one or  
Tenants in Common, but if the one or more so dying should leave no child  
or children then his her or their share shall go to the survivors & survivor

viz. one moiety thereof to and for his uses and the other moiety in trust  
to and for the sole and separate use of Mrs Ann & Morris his wife  
to and for such use or uses as she by any Writing Deed or Will, limit or  
afford and in default of such appointment, to and for the use and  
behalf of such Child or Children Grand Child or Grand Children  
as she shall have living at her death his her or their Executors Administrators

and a piece of wood to me in Boston I caused the same to be  
marked in the Courts Stock and being sent to the

Lot M 10 to my Brother James Dohr her hair and eyes gray  
Lot M 11 to my Brother John Dohr her hair and eyes gray  
Lot M 12 to my Sister Anna Dohr her hair and eyes gray  
Lot M 13 to my Relation William & Lewis her hair and eyes gray  
Lot M 14 to my Relation Sabina & Ruthful her hair and eyes gray  
Item I give and bequeath my Certificate of the United States Loan office bearing  
an Interest of three per Cent and sum owing in principal to him now and  
five hundred and thirty six dollars to the chairman of the Meeting of the  
Puritan Friends Church of Saint Paul in Rochester New York and his  
successors in office forever in trust nevertheless that he and they will  
divide the joint lives of my Sisters Sabina and Cecilia Dohr and the  
affection I bear of them set aside of the Interest of the said loan for  
the use of the said church all such appointments as may be imposed on it  
and by my Prob M 35 in said church and pay unto the said Sabina and  
Cecilia Lewis equally between them during their joint lives and to the

some provision may be required for him on account of his age I declare  
it to be my Will and do hereby direct that such Expence and provision  
shall be taken out of my said £100 given Shares in the State Bank. Item I  
give and bequeath the residue of my said £100 Shares in the State Bank  
after payment of my Debts which are but small, and the Expence and  
provision of manumitting from Slavery my said Servant Jupiter unto  
my Brother in Law the Revd Dr William Percy as a token of my Aimen-  
blance, his Executors Administrators and assigns. Item whereas I have  
already given a Deed of Gift for my mulatto boy Benjamin to my G  
Stephens Percy Lewis who is in England but the said Share is still  
in my possession. And whereas I have also given a Deed of Gift for  
my black boy Stephen to my Niece Daniel Percy but the said Share  
is still in my possession. I do therefore hereby confirm the said Deeds  
and give to each of them respectively the said Shares as given by Dr

my black boy Stephen to my Niece Charlotte Poy but the said Slave  
is still in my possession. I do therefore hereby Release the said Deeds  
and give to each of them respectively the said Slaves so given by Deed  
to him and her his and her Executors, Administrators and assigns. Item  
the Rest and Residue of my Estate Real and Personal whatsoever and  
wherever it may be I give devise and bequeath to and  
between my stepsons Richard B. Baker and Bernard Elliott Poy  
their heirs Executors Administrators and assigns forever as Tenants in  
Common. Lastly I nominate and appoint my friends Bob Lewis  
Morris and Mr Thomas Parker the Elder Executor of this my last Will  
and Testament hereby naming all others by me heretofore made. In
