N^o 21. In the Name of God Amen. I Ann Moore, of St. John's Parish, Charleston District, being weak in body, but in perfect mind and memory, do make and ordain this my last and only true Will, revoking all former Wills made by me. First I recommend my soul to God who gave it. Secondly I recommend that my body be decently buried in a Christianlike manner. As touching my worldly affairs, It is my desire that all just debts be paid and the remainder of my Estate to be divided in the following manner. First I give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Charlotte Weatherford three Negroes, namely, Rep and her two Children Bain and Sary. Secondly I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Harriet Toule, two Negroes, namely, Polidore and Lucy. I also give and bequeath to my daughter Charlotte Weatherford, that tract of land, in the Gaillard Road where she now lives. I give and bequeath to my Grandson John Godfrey one bow and ball. It is my desire that my daughter Harriet Tuttle should have one feather bed and furniture, at the same price that my daughter Charlotte paid me for hers. It is also my desire, that all my horses and cattle, Household and Kitchen furniture, and two thirds of my brogs be sold as soon as may be convenient to my Executors, and the moneys apply^d to the purchase of a negro girl for my daughter Harriet. It is also my desire, that the property which I bequeath to each of my daughters above mentioned be appraised, & should the Share

one amount to more than the other it shall be made up by the one
having the largest share to the one having the smallest. So that they all
may have an equal share of my Estate. It is my desire that the
remaining time of the Lease of the Plantation whereon I now live
be sold, and the moneys arising from such Sales go to my daughter
having the smallest share of my Estate. All the property which I have
given to my two daughters Charlotte Weatherford and Harriet Tully
I give to them during their natural life, and after their death,
to go to their lawful heirs of their Bodies, no sale made by either of their
Husbands shall be valid unless by ^{the} consent of one or both of my
Executors, and they my Executors have power to prevent such property
from being moved off the State. Lastly I nominate my trusty friends
James Richbough and Thomas Leitch Junr. my lawful executors
to this my last Will. In witness whereof I have set my hands and
affixed my Seal this 27th day of August 1816. Ann Moore (L.S.)
