P. 30. Battle, a free colored person of the city of Charleston, in the State  
aforesaid, being weak in body but of sound, disposing mind; do  
make this my last Will and Testament in manner following,  
that is to say. I direct the whole of my Estate, consisting of any  
and whatever Shares I may die possessed of in the Planter, and  
Mechanic's Bank of this State, or of any other Bank: also of a negro  
woman Slave named Nanny, about thirty eight years of age,  
lately purchased by me from <sup>M. Motta</sup> the widow of Isaac Motta deceased,  
with her future issue and increase: Also of a negro man  
named Bob: and all the rest and residue of my Estate whereon  
situated. to be disposed of by my Executors herein after named or  
either of them, in manner following, that is to say. That my  
said Executors shall receive the wages of the said wench, Nanny  
and whenever she shall be able to advance to my Executors the  
sum of Five hundred and fifty dollars (\$550) which I paid for  
her, it is my desire and I do hereby empower my said  
Executors either to emancipate or to make any other dispo-  
sition of the said wench, which she may then request; I  
also direct my said Executors or either of them to sell the said  
negro fellow Bob as soon as convenient after my decease, and  
to divide the Nett proceeds of such sale equally between my  
friends Patrick McGann, and my daughter Mrs. Rebecca

Shall and Stand aliy, the sum of my real estate and personalty  
of said Executrix, do test for the sole and separate use and benefit  
behalf of my said daughter, free from the control of any husband  
whom she may hereafter marry. I further direct my said Executrix  
to hold the rest and residue of my said Estate, In trust as aforesaid  
for the sole and separate use benefit and behalf of my said daughter  
Jane Rebecca McGann absolutely free from the control of any hus-  
band she may hereafter marry. Lastly I <sup>do</sup> hereby constitute  
and appoint Lewis H. Stevens, and Louise H. Remond Eggers  
Executors of this my late Will and Testament freely revoking  
all other Wills by me heretofore made. In witness whereof  
the said Barshaba Battle, have hereunto set my hand and seal  
at Charleston, this twenty fourth <sup>day</sup> of December in the year of our Lord  
One thousand eight hundred and eighteen and in the forty third year  
of American Independence.

In case my said Daughter Jane Rebecca McGann, should die un-  
married and without lawful issue. I then give and bequeath unto  
the said Patrick McGann, the whole of the property bequeathed to my  
said daughter, if he should survivor her, but in case the said Patrick  
McGann should die before the said Jane Rebecca McGann. I then  
bequeath to my said daughter the whole of the Property bequeathed to  
the said Patrick McGann.
