and advantage and further I do also give and bequeath unto my  
mother all my plate and furniture of every kind and description

in possession or expectancy not before disposed of in the first and  
second clause of this my Will. that is to say in trust for my  
affectionate Son Alexander S. Magyck, to use and enjoy the  
annual profits rents and incomes thereof after he shall have  
attained the age of twenty one years and from thence forward my

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Will and desire herein being that my Mother should upon my death  
arriving at the age of twenty one years leaving to and secure to him  
and his male heirs lawfully begotten the use rents income & annual  
profits of all the property in the last clause mentioned without sub-  
jecting in any manner whatever the property so bequeathed to his  
present or future debts or contracts debts or incumbrances, as to the debts  
contracts debts or incumbrances of any such male child or children he  
may hereafter have. Fourthly if my mother should disapprove or be  
dissatisfied with the conduct of my Brother Alexander Mayzack  
my Will and desire is that she should deprive the said Alexander  
Mayzack of all the benefit and advantage intended to be conferred  
on him by the third clause of this my Will and she is hereby empower-  
ed, after the arrival or before the period fixed for him to take &  
enjoy the said property, upon assigning the cause herein mentioned  
to consider the property designed for his use, as absolutely his own &  
to dispose of the same as she may please and direct. And lastly I nomi-  
nate constitute and appoint my Mother Mary Mayzack Sole Executrix
