I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my Body I recommend to the Earth, from whence it came, to be Buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors, trusting doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and trusting such worldly Estate which it pleased God to bless me with in this Life - I give devise bequeath of the same in the following manner and form Viz: After paying all my legal Debts first I give bequeath to Lucy my dear & beloved Wife the whole of my Real and personal Estate - Whom I likewise constitute Make & ordain the sole Executrix of this my last will & Testament, all and singular my lands Messuages and tenements, by her freely to be Possessed and enjoyed, for her own use and the use of my four Children Equally, and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Testament Wills - bequeaths, Bequests and Executors, by me in any way before-willed bequeathed ratifying and confirming this Witness whereof I have hereunto
