

## WILL OF

JAMES CALIOTE

In the Name of God Amen, I James Caliote being Sick & Weak in Body but of Perfect Mind & Memory thanks to God for the same & calling to mind the Mortality of this Body & that it is appointed for all men once to Die, do make & constitute this my Last Will & Testament, but first of all I commit my Spirit to the Hands of God who gave, & my Body to the Earth to be decently interred, at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but I shall receive the same again at the resurrection of the just Day, and be again reunited by the almighty power of God, and as for such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to endow me with, I do hereby dispose of in manner & Form following, that is to say after my just debts & funeral charges be paid justly paid, First I give & bequeath unto my well beloved wife Mary Caliote the use of the plantation whereon I now live, & also the use of three Negroes, namely King, Bill Brown, & Gumbo a boy with all the necessaries & necessitation menials with the plantation horses & other stock of every kind, that is during her Natural life, provided nevertheless that my said wife Mary Caliote does keep her Negroes Tom & Jenny together with my aforesaid Negroes for the maintenance & habitation of my children James, Blake, Doler, & John Caliote and last of all John Williams if she chooses to take them home, and after her death, I give & bequeath all my personal estate, that shall then be divided, to be equally divided between all my children & the executors of my will, then I give & bequeath unto my son James Caliote the land & plantation whereon I now live to him & his heirs forever, & it is my sincere desire, that my executors hereafter mentioned shall go with my son James Caliote to witness & see to it, that my son James Caliote having a power of attorney to receive debts there due to me, very considerable to be adjusted, equally divided between all my children & my other estate & I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my trusty friend Gilson Wilson to be my just & full executors, & lififying confirming this to be my just will & Testament revoking all other wills, or testaments & intitols where I have executed & my Hand & seal this twelfth day of February 1777

The State of South Carolina, In the Name of God Amen I George Wood of Charles in the State aforesaid Bookseller and Stationer being Sick & Weak in body, but of Sound and disposing mind Testimony of & concerning the Worldly Estate where with it hath my Just Debts & funeral Expences are fully & ultimately paid & satisfied, I Do hereby give, Devise and Bequeath in manner & form following (that to say) I primitis. I Give & bequeath unto my beloved & affectionate Wife Ann Wood my Negro Boy named Caesar, also any one of my Negro Enches, which she shall make choice of and Elect and her future Issue & Increase & also such choice of and Elect and her future Issue & Increase I also such of my household Furniture, which she my said wife shall Elect & make choice of sufficient to furnish a Room in Charles Town for her to live in, To Hold the same to her my said wife & her issue for ever, In testimony of my Love and affection for my said wife am I do hereby give and bequeath unto her my said wife the use & occupation of all & Singular Plate of every Species and Denomination &c for & during the term of her natural Life, & from & immediately after her decease I give and bequeath the said Plate of every Species & denomination (Except
