day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred & fourteen, and Thirty ninth year
of the sovereignty and Independence of the United States
of America, make and publish this, my last Will
and Testament in Manner following & viz. first I
give thequeath to my dear Wife Elizabeth Windsor,
all that lot of land situate, lying, and being on Main
land, known and distinguished in the plans of the City
of Charleston by the Number 5 (five) together with
the two meadows or Tenements thereon, the one of
Brick where I now reside, the other of wood on the
South east corner of the said lot fronting eastwardly
on the said land, and now rented out, as also my
slaves Man Joshua, and all the rest & Residue of my
goods, chattels and personal Estate whatsoever to
have & to hold to her uses all the aforementioned
premises during her Natural life: & from and after

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day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred & fourteen, and Thirty ninth year
of the sovereignty and Independence of the United States
of America, make and publish this, my last Will
and Testament in Manner following: viz. first I
give thequeath to my dear Wife Elizabeth Windsor,
all that lot of land situate, lying, and being on Main
land, known and distinguished in the plans of the City
of Charleston by the Number 5 (five) together with
the two meadows or Trimmings thereon, the one of
Brick where I now reside, the other of wood on the
South east corner of the said lot fronting eastwardly
on the said land, and now rented out, as also my
step son Joshua, and all the rest & Remainder of my
goods, chattels and personal Estate whatsoever to
have & to hold to her use all the aforementioned
premises during her Natural life; & from and after
her decease, I give & devise the same to my two Children
James & Isaac Windsor, to be equally divided between
share and share alike, and I do constitute & ordain
my said Wife, to be Executrix & James Drummond
my good and worthy friend to be Executor of this
my Will, to take said and see the same performed

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to my true intent & meaning. I in Witness whereof
I the said Thomas Windsor have to this my last
Will and Testament set my hand & seal, the day
and year above written. Thomas Windsor
Signed, Sealed and Delivered by the said
Thomas Windsor as and for his last Will & Testament
in the presence of us, who were present at the
signing and sealing thereof -
