discretion do make and declare my last will and testament
in manner and form following: I expressly desire that
my funeral expences be paid out of the interests that may
be due on any money, bonds or note which shall belong to
me at the time of my death. Item I give and bequeath
Five hundred pounds out of a bond for One thousand pounds
due me by my Son in law Jonathan Lucas Senior, to my said
Son in law Jonathan Lucas Senior his Executors and Administrators
in trust nevertheless to pay the interests of the said sum of
Five hundred pounds to my daughter Mrs. Mary Maybank
annually during her natural life; and from and after the
death of my said daughter I give and bequeath the said sum
of Five hundred pounds to my daughter Sarah Lydia
Lucas (the wife of the said Jonathan Lucas Senior) her Ex-
ecutors and Administrators for ever. Item I give and bequeath
the further sum of Five hundred pounds out of the said bond to
my daughter the said Sarah Lydia Lucas her Executors and
Administrators for ever, Item I give bequeath the remaining
two hundred pounds due on the said bond to my son and

my funeral expenses be paid out of the interests that may
be due on any money, bonds or note which shall belong to
me at the time of my death. Item I give and bequeath
Five hundred pounds out of a bond for Twelve hundred pounds
due me by my Son in law Jonathan Lucas Junior, to my said
Son in law Jonathan Lucas Junior his Executors and Administrators
in trust nevertheless to pay the interests of the said sum of
Five hundred pounds to my daughter Mrs. Mary Mayhew
annually during her natural life; and from and after the
death of my said daughter I give and bequeath the said sum
of Five hundred pounds to my daughter Sarah Lydia
Lucas (the wife of the said Jonathan Lucas Junior) her Ex-
ecutors and Administrators for ever. Item I give and bequeath
the further sum of Five hundred pounds out of the said bond to
my daughter the said Sarah Lydia Lucas her Executors and
Administrators for ever. Item I give the bequeath the remaining
two hundred pounds due on the said bond to my four grand-
daughters Lydia Ball Lucas, Eleanor Jane Lucas, Elizabeth
Bryan Lucas & Mary Ann Gickey Lucas their Executors and
Administrators for ever share & share alike. Item I give the bequeath
my negro Wench Louisa and her future issue and increase
to my four grand children Elizabeth Bryan Lucas, & Edward

Pennsylvania - I Sarah Hollinshead, Relict and
Widow of the late Reverend Doctor William Hollinshead
of Charleston South Carolina, being of sound and
disposing mind and memory; but mindful of the certainty
of death, do make this my last will and Testament.
I do commit my Soul into the hands of my Redeemer;
hoping and trusting in his Righteousness alone for my
Salvation, I wish my Body to be removed to Charleston
to be interred with my dear Doctor Hollinshead -
I pronounce, release, quit claim and confirm
to the surviving Heirs of John McCall, and to their Heirs
& assigns forever, all the Interest Estate which I may
have, or can claim to a Tract of Land called "Hartford"
containing about three hundred & one acres & three quarters,
situate in the County of Northumberland in the State of
Pennsylvania: And also to another Tract of Land called
Mount Lorne, containing the same quantity of Land and
situate in the same County & State, together with all the
