and Effects of whatever nature or kind I own (with the Exception of the first Item)
And I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my said Wife Lavinia
Perrin Executrix my Brother Samuel Bunge my partner Benjamin Rhett
Smith and my worthy friend Charles Ketchum Executors to this my last Will
and Testament hereby revoking and making void all and every other Will
or Wills at any time heretofore made by me and do declare this to be my
