I Charles Doughty of the City of Charleston, in the District and State aforesaid, Physician, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making null and void all other or former Will or Wills by me at any time heretofore made. I am

primis I order and direct all my just and lawful debts to be paid.
Item. I give and bequeath to my sisters, Emma Julia Doughty and Ge-
orgiana Washington Hadleston, to each the Sum of Three Thousand Dollars,
to them and their Heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath the Sum of
Two thousand Dollars to the "Trustees of the Protestant Episcopal Society
for the advancement of Christianity in South Carolina" In trust for
the Bishop's permanent Fund," established by a resolution of the convention
of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the State of South Carolina" passed the
20th day of February 1818, to be invested and applied according to the Rules of
that Society. Item. In consideration of our Friendship I give and bequeath
to Samuel Goudin Junior the Sum of one Thousand Dollars, to him
and his heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath to James Doughty the
Sum of One thousand Dollars in Trust for Rebecca Ann Goudin,
to be by him invested in Bank Stock, Government Security or otherwise,
as he shall deem ^{most} advantageous - I order and direct that the interest
arising from the same shall go to the accumulation of the Stock until said
Rebecca shall have completed her education; at which period I desire, and
it is my Will, that her said Trustee James Doughty, shall pay over the
said Sum of money with the accumulated Interest to Miss Louisa C.
Goudin and S. Goudin Junior, whom I appoint with the same to
select and purchase a Library, consisting of such Books as they shall deem
most beneficial and improving for the use of the said Rebecca, to be
held by her and her heirs as their absolute property. Item. In Edward

To Edward Harleston Junior I give and bequeath the gold Watch, with the chain and Trinkets (excepting the Seal which contains the family coat of arms, which is herein^{after} given to James Doughty) which I am now under the expectation of receiving from England, to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give devise and bequeath to my brother Doctor James Doughty all the rest of my property, both real and personal, of every sort, kind and description, which I may die possessed of, as also all the property which I am entitled to by and under the Will of my late father William Doughty and likewise all other property rights and credits, which belong to me, or are or may become due, owing and payable to me, to him, his heirs, Executors, administrators and assigns forever. Lastly I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my friends Bartholomew Gaillard William Doughty, James Doughty, Edward Harleston Junior & L. Gourain Junior Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this twenty seventh day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and eight and in the forty third year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America.
