George, Colleton District in the State of South Carolina do hereby

190. declare and publish this my last Will and Testament in man-
ner and form following: I deprive Whereas at the time of my
intermarriage with my beloved wife Mary Rosen, she was enti-
tled to her Dower in her late husband Benjamin Ladson's Estate
which right of Dower I made over to her by a Deed of Marriage
Settlement to certain persons therein named in trust to her
use and behoof, which I do hereby ratify and confirm. But for the
love I bear to my said wife and that a further provision be
made for her support in addition to her right of Dower which
she is entitled to in her former husband's Estate, now in the pos-
session of her son Charles B. Ladson and in lieu of all right claim
or demands, of what nature soever she my said wife may have
on or to my Estate or in any manner or form whatsoever, other
than is hereinafter expressed: I give unto my said Wife the
use of my Dwelling House and all the out Buildings contiguous
thereto, together with Fifty acres of lands around the same: provided
it does not take for the dam commonly called the Machine Dam or
any of the streams or water courses that lead to or from the same
or any Buildings or Machinery that may be erected thereon for
during her natural life, if she my said wife should reside so
long thereon: but in case my said wife does not personally reside
thereon, this right to cease and determine. I also give to my
said wife the privilege of taking Firewood for her use on the

during her natural life, if she my said wife should reside so long thereon: but in case my said wife does not personally reside thereon, this right to cease and determine. I also give to my said wife the privilege of taking Firewood for her own use, that is to say, for Fire in the House, Kitchen and other out Houses, from any part of the Land I may possess at the time of my decease, for and during her natural life or residence as aforesaid. I give unto my said wife the use of my Household Furniture, Kitchen Utensils and Silver for & during her natural life (The following articles, to wit a Barrel organ, a Pier glass, an Easy Chair and a half set of Drawers are not to be considered as part of my Furniture). I give unto my said wife the labor and Services of the following negroes Slaves to wit, Dick, Quilla, Monday, and Kate and whatever child or children she (Quilla) may hereafter have; Flora and her child Betty, and whatever child or children she (Flora) may hereafter have, for and during the term of her natural life. I give unto my said Wife my Riding Chair and Horse or Horses that I may possess at the time of my decease, also my horse cart. I give unto my said wife, one third part of the crop of Provisions that may be on the grounds or on hand at the time of my decease, one third part of whatever other crop there may be on the grounds or on hand at the time of my decease, or money if sold, that it may be sold for, or any part that may be sold after all the Expenses of the Plantation and Debts (if any) are paid. Also six head of Milch cows

with three balers, One four year old, one three year old, and one two
year old Steers; if there should be such among the Stock, one third
part of my Sheep, and one third part of my hogs. I give unto
my said wife the Portrait painting, the Scripture Piece repre-
senting the three women at the Sepulchre; and the Books men-
tioned under number One in the catalogue hereunto annexed.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son in law Thomas Davis
Stall, the husband of my daughter Sarah Mary, the Plantation
or tract of land on which I now reside, containing four hundred
and fifty nine acres, subject to the provisions above specified,
to him and his heirs forever. I also give and bequeath unto my
said Son in law Thomas Davis Stall in addition to the negro
Slaves already given him on his marriage with my said daugh-
ter and since the following negro Slaves to wit, Mingo, Pitt, Sam,
Philo, Satyra, and her children Charlotte, Cyrus, Peter, Sam & Maria.
Patience & her three children Mingo, Dora & Martha, with the future
issue and increase of the females to him and his heirs forever. I
further give unto my said Son in law the Books mentioned under
Number two in the catalogue hereunto annexed, the piece of drawing
representing Negroes drawing a Makogany Box containing Gil Co-
lours and Brushes: and my morocco Shaving case. Item. I
give ^{& bequeath} unto Son John Simon Rose all that ~~the~~

lous and Brushes: and my morocco Shaving Case. Item. I
give ^{bequeath} unto Son John Simon Rose all that Plantation or tract of
Land containing two hundred acres, which was purchased by
Morton Waring from John Baker, subject to the provision above
specified to him and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto said Son
John Simon Rose in addition to the negro Slaves already in his pos-
session, the following negro Slaves, to wit Annell ~~him~~ ^{her} Dianna
Beck and her children, Tom, March, Matilda Manuel & Henry. Tommy
and her children blues and Jimmy and Delia and her children besor,
with the future issue and increase of the females to him & his heirs
forever. I also give to my said Son the pieces of writing entitled "Recreation
in Penmanship"; the Drawing representing a Family affray, and the
Piece representing a naval engagement. My mahogany Shaving Case
a Box of Reeves Water colours, and the Books mentioned under num-
ber three in the subjoined catalogue. Item. I give to my friend
Thomas Smith and request his acceptance as a small mark of my
esteem the Books mentioned under number Four in the subjoined
catalogue. Item. Whatever there may be remaining of my Estate not
herein disposed of, I give to be equally divided between my said
Son in law Thomas Davis Stale and my said Son John Simon Rose
Share and Share alike, Item. At the decease of my wife I give to
my Son in law Thomas D. Stale the negro Slaves Dick, Quillo, Monday,

nate constitute and appoint my Son in law Thomas Davis State
and my Son John Simon Rose Executors of this my last Will

of my blessed Redeemer, and my Body I desire to be buried in a
decent Christianlike manner at the discretion of my Executors herein
after named. Item. Touching such worldly Estate as it has pleased
God to bless me with, I give devise and bequeath the same as
follows. I give and bequeath unto my Executors hereinafter
named or such of them as may qualify my faithful negro
man Sam (the carpenter) on this special Trust and confidence
that he shall take care of the same for the use of my family.
