I David Lamb of the City of Charleston in the State of South Carolina Merchant, being in indifferent health of body, and of sound & disposing memory and mind, Do make publish and declare this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say I amprimis, I will order and direct all my just debts & funeral Expenses to be paid as soon as may be convenient after my death

Item I give and bequeath unto Mrs. Jane Whistler the Wife of Mr. John
Whistler, and unto her son David Lamb Whistler the sum of Five hundred
Dollars each, and it is my Will and desire that the legacy of Five hundred
Dollars to Mrs. Jane Whistler shall be to and for her own sole and separate use
and that she shall have Liberty notwithstanding her Coverture to dispose thereof
at her Will and pleasure. Item it is my intention to give to each of my two
Nephews James and Peter Robertson the sum of Five hundred pounds Sterling
and should I die before I carry this intention into full Effect then I give and
bequeath to each of my said two Nephews so much money as will make
up to each of them the sum of Five hundred pounds Sterling a piece
Item I give and bequeath to my three Nieces Sarah Cunningham Margaret
Miller and Katherine Sampson Daughters of my Sister Katherine Miller
Three hundred pounds Sterling a piece. Item I give and bequeath unto each
of my three Sisters Katherine Miller Christian Lamb and Margaret
Robertson for and during their natural lives respectively, an annuity or clear
yearly sum of Fifty Pounds Sterling to be paid to them Annually in half yearly
payments of Twenty five pounds each at the times of Whitsunday & Martinmas
in every year during their respective natural lives, my said Sisters at present
reside in or near Aberdeen City & County Scotland. Item I give and bequeath
unto my good friends William McGavin and Isabella his Wife or to the
Survivor of them the sum of three hundred pounds Sterling. Item I give and
bequeath to the Presbyterian Church of the City of Charleston of which I have
been a member for many years the sum of One Thousand Dollars Item I give & bequeath

Survivors of them the sum of three hundred and seventy five dollars
bequeath to the Presbyterian Church of the City of Charleston of which I have
been so long an Elder the sum of One Thousand Dollars Item I give & bequeath
unto my dear daughter in Law Mary Lamb the sum of Three thousand
Dollars and unto each of my dear Grandchildren Mary and Janet in equal
Parts the sum of Four thousand Dollars a piece Item I give devise and
bequeath all the rest residue and remainder of my Estate and Effects real and
personal heritable and moveable whatsoever and Wheresoever unto my dear
Sons David Lamb and James Lamb their heirs and assigns for ever to be
Equally divided between them Share and Share alike as Tenant in common
Lastly I do hereby constitute nominate and appoint my Dear Sons David
Lamb and James Lamb Executors of this my Last Will and Testament hereby
revoking and annulling all former and other Wills movable gifts grants assign-
ments and dispositions intended to operate after my death by me heretofore
made and ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my Last Will
and Testament In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
Seal this Seventh day of July in the Year of our Lord one thousand
Eight hundred and twenty and in the forty fifth year of the Sovereignty &
