for which I humbly praise the great Creator of the  
Universe) and considering the certainty of death, and  
the uncertainty of the time thereof, and to the end that I  
may be better prepared to leave this world whenever it shall  
please the Almighty to call me hence do therefore make  
and declare this my last will and Testament in the manner  
following that is to say Firstly I bequeath my body to the  
dust from whence it came and commend my immortal soul  
to the living God who gave and protected it my body to be  
interred in the usual form in the Cemetery of the German  
Evangelical Lutheran Church. Secondly to my sister Anna  
I give and bequeath the sum of five dollars to be paid  
her out of my Estate by my Executor. Thirdly I also bequeath  
the sum of five dollars to my brother Carsten Seebick to be  
paid him by my Executors out of the proceeds of my Estate  
Fourthly All and singular my property real and  
personal, the real Estate consisting of a lot as the South  
West corner of Cannon <sup>& Smith</sup> Streets Charleston Neck, to-  
gether with the two houses thereon the whole more fully  
designated in the titles from M<sup>r</sup>. Alex<sup>r</sup>. Black dated  
the 21<sup>st</sup> March 1839 I give and bequeath all and singular

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the sum of five dollars to my brother Carsten Sebeck to be  
paid him by my Executor out of the proceeds of my Estate.  
Fourthly. All and singular my property real and  
personal, the real Estate consisting of a lot as the South  
West corner of Cannon <sup>& with</sup> Street's Charleston Neck, to-  
gether with the two houses thereon the whole more fully  
designated in the titles from Mr. Alex. Black dated  
the 21<sup>st</sup> March 1839. I give and bequeath all and singularly  
to Mr. Henry Zehe for the kind and affectionate care I  
have experienced at his hand during my protracted  
painful illness, and to evince my everlasting gratitude  
for the same enjoining him never the less to pay out of  
my said Estate all my just debts ~~and~~ <sup>my</sup> funeral expenses  
and the above named legacies respectively to my brother and  
sister Anne. And for the better carrying this my last will  
into proper effect and to execute the same, I do by these  
presents name and appoint the said Mr. Henry Zehe my  
Executor for with respect whereof I Deduct Sebeck  
have to this my will consisting of one sheet of paper  
set my hand and seal after carefully reading and reconsider-  
ing the same. Charleston S.C. the 11<sup>th</sup> May 1846

lot situate on East Bay Street known by the No 157 and  
at present occupied by Mr. N. A. Chen the rents thereof  
to be equally divided between them share & share alike  
Should my daughter Eliza aforesaid die without leaving  
issue living at her death then &c.
