DAVID YOUNGBLOOD

In the Name of God Amen, I David Youngblood of Charleston district State of South Carolina planter, being of perfect mind and Memory thanks be to God for the same, Calling to mind the Mortality of the Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, That is <sup>to</sup> say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of God that Gave it, And as touching Such Worldly Estate, wherewith it hath pleased God to blefs me it this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in the Manner and form following, That is to say, in the first place I Will that all my Just debts be fully paid, I Will

to my Aged Mother the Sum of Ten pounds Sterling, for Each Year, during her Natural lifetime, and desire that my Executors will be punctual in paying my said Mother the Said Sum of Ten pounds Sterling Annually, that is  $\frac{1}{2}$  say, on the first day of Each and every March, after my Death, during her Natural life. Item I will all the remainder of my Estate as well real as personal to my beloved Wife Lucretia and any Child or Children She may have or be pregnant of at the time of my Death, in the following manner <sup>t</sup>Vis: all my Personal Estate to be equally divided Share and Share alike. my Said Child, or Children to be put into possession at the Age of Twenty One if a Son, if a Girl at the Age of Nineteen or day of Marriage, My Real Estate to remain in the possession of my Said Wife Lucretia during her Natural Life, and then to go to my Children or their Heirs. Item Should I leave no Issue as aforesaid, or having Issue and they to die before they come to the Ages aforesaid, then it is my Will that my Said Wife Lucretia Shall have and enjoy the whole of my Estate during her Natural Life, And at her death Should She die without other lawful Issue, the Estate to be divided between my Brothers Peter & Isaac Youngblood's Children, and my Sister's Children that She has had by her former Husband Peter Hyne, But should it happen that my Said Wife Lucretia Should Marry after my Decease, then die, leaving lawfull Issue, then and in that Case I Will that my said Wife may Will and devise the one half of my Estate as aforesaid to such Issue, the other half to be divided between my Brothers and Sisters Children as aforesaid, Lastly I do <sup>&</sup>Constitute, make ~~and~~ ordain my beloved Wife Lucretia Executrix, and my Brothers Peter and Isaac Youngblood, and my Friend Hilman Hutchins Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, Ratifying & Confirming this and no other to be my last Will, and Testament. in Witnefs whereof I have hereunto Set my hand & Seal this 29<sup>th</sup> day of May 1790.
