In the Name of God, I, Edward Dowling, of the City of Charleston & State aforesaid, citizen of the United States of America and late of the County of Tyrone Ireland by profession a Bricklayer being ^{very} weak and low in body, but of sound and disposing mind & memory, blessed be God for the same, calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all ones to die, do make and ordain this my Last Will & Testament in manner and form following. First & principally I accom-
mend my Soul to God, who gave it & my body to the earth of which it was made to be buried in a decent, pious and Christian like man-
ner nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the almighty power of God, my Creator, hoping for
pardon & remission of all my sins, & to enjoy everlasting happiness
in his heavenly Kingdom thro' the sole merit and mediation of Jesus
Christ my blessed Saviour, and as touching such worldly estate as
hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give give devise & bequeath
in the following manner. Item I give and bequeath to my honored
Mother Eleanor Dowling now living in the County Tyrone, Ireland,

the Sum of Four Hundred Dollars to be paid to her as soon after my
decease as circumstances will permit & in case of her death before she shall
receive the same, then & in that case the said Sum of Four hundred
Dollars, shall be paid to my beloved Sisters Eleanor & Margaret, living
in the said County of Tyrone, Ireland, ofore said, to be divided between
them share and share alike, but in the case of the death of one of
them & in that case to be paid to the Survivor of them. Item I give
and bequeath to my beloved Brother John Dowling Six Hundred
Dollars to be paid to him as soon after my decease as circumstances
will permit. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Elizabeth
Dowling and my three children namely, namely
Julia, Elizabeth Eleanor, and Margaret the rest and residue of all
my estate both real and personal whatsoever situated to them
& their Heirs forever, share & share alike, after the payment of all
my just debts, dues and demands and it is my Will that the
aforesaid children shall not receive their share or part of my Estate
until they shall arrive at the age of twenty one years or day of
marriage & that they be educated maintained and clothed from the
proceeds of said Estate during their minority & that in case of a post-
humous child that may hereafter in due time be born from my
beloved wife, that in that case it shall be entitled to a child's part
if it survives to the age of twenty one or the day of marriage & in case if

the following negro slaves, viz Big Jim, little Jim, big George, little
George, Prince, Anthony, Jeffy, York, Buffy, Adam, Ben, Edward,
Sancho, males, and Mary, Sue, and three children Hannah, Jim
& John and Lydia and her child William - also all my household
