No. 13. } South Carolina, In the Name of God Amen. I Eliza
Turner of the City of Charleston Widow being weak in
body but of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding
do make and publish this to be my last Will & testament First
after my just debts and funeral expences are paid I give and
bequeath unto my beloved Niece now of New York Mrs Eliza
Hovattney formerly Eliza Hasket Francis Haskett and Sarah Has-
kett children of my beloved Brother Joseph Haskett the large
Mack leather trunk now in my pofsefsion with all of its con-
tents to be equally divided between them share and share alike
except my gold watch which I desire specifically to be delivered
unto my said niece Mrs Eliza Hovattney. My Silver watch I desire
to be delivered unto my said beloved Brother Joseph Haskett
to be retained by him until at any time hereafter he may have
it in his power to deliver it unto John Turner the son of my
Late Husband, when I wish him to do so, and in case a certain
sum of money amount unknown, should hereafter be received from
the British Government on account of a pension due unto my said
Late husband in his Life time, I will and bequeath the same
unto my said nieces and my beloved Sister Mrs Esther Bowen now
resident of the State of New York to be divided and paid over
to them in equal proportions. And it is further my Will and
pleasure that my Executor hereafter named so soon after my
decease as Convenient do Sell my Negro slave Nancy as also my
milch Cow and that he do appropriate the proceeds thereof as
above that is to say unto my aforesaid Nieces and my said Sister
Mrs Esther Bowen to whom I give and bequeath the same share and
share alike. And Lastly as to all the rest residue and remainder
of my estate goods chattels and effects of what kind or nature
soever I give and bequeath the same unto my Nephews Richard
Boak, Edward Boak and Henry Boak. And I do hereby nominate and
appoint.....

Sole Executor of this my Last Will and testament hereby

of I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this thirteenth
day of August, A.D. one thousand Eight hundred and
twenty Six and in the fifty first year of the Sovereign-
ty and Independence of the United States of America.
