Item, it is my Will that my Nephew Benjamin  
Whitemarsh Seabrook Jenkins shall have the use and service  
of my mulatto Slave named Hetty, until he arrives to the age of  
Twenty two years and no longer: And as to my said Slave Hetty  
I leave her particularly to be made free so soon as my nephew Benjamin  
Whitemarsh Seabrook Jenkins arrives to the age of twenty two years:  
and I also will that my said nephew Benjamin W. S. Jenkins pay, or  
cause to be paid to my Slave Hetty one hundred Dollars on his arriving  
to the age of Twenty two years. Provided that my said nephew Benjamin  
Whitemarsh Seabrook Jenkins be living, otherwise and in case  
he be not living, I leave my said Slave Hetty to be made free,  
immediately at his death, and the sum of two hundred Dollars paid  
her, as soon as conveniently can be, after my said nephew Benjamin  
W.S. Jenkins' decease. Item I give and devise all the residue of my  
Estate real and personal and of whatsoever kind or wheresoever the  
same may be to my nephew Benjamin Whitemarsh Seabrook Jenkins  
to his heirs, ~~executors~~ administrators and assigns forever. Provided my  
said nephew Benjamin be living at the age of twenty one years,  
or leaveth lawful issue. Otherwise & in case he dies before he arrives  
to the age of Twenty one and leaves no lawful issue I give and  
devise all the said residue of my Estate, unto the children then  
living of my Sisters Providence Mikell - Ann Ninian Baynard,

and the children of my deceased Brother Isaac Jenkins - that is to
