N^o 44. aforesaid, do hereby make and declare this to be my last Will
Testament, I give and bequeath to my Son Nelson my gold
chain & appendages, to my Son John Stewart my gold sleeve
tons and to my daughter Eliza Jane two thousand dollars (in
addition to what is hereinafter devised & bequeathed to her) I give
my wearing apparel to my mother, Lucy Deas & my da
ter Amelia, to be equally divided among them, each to choose
articles they prefer, but if they cannot agree the division shall
be made by Rosy Sommers & Jane Roupell. I give to my four
my wardrobe, trunks, bedsteads, liquors & commonest chairs
be kept for their use, if necessary & then to be divided ^{equally} among them.
I direct my Executors hereinafter named to allow to my mother
a reasonable sum of money, monthly, for the purpose of sup
plying her wants & comforts. All my bedding, sheets, blankets
quilts, towels, silver, plate, & Bank Shares I give to my five ble
now in this city to be equally divided among them share &
alike. I direct that my brockery, glassware, ^{large} damask table cloth
& the furniture not hereinbefore bequeathed may be sold for the pay
of my debts and legacies & I authorize ^{and empower} my Executors to make
also authorize ^{my} said Executors to sell and dispose of all
estate real or personal (not herein before disposed of) for the purpose

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discharging the said debts and legacies, should the property of
predeceased be insufficient for the objects, relative thereto, from
the same, or any part or parts thereof, if in their judgments on
Sale or Sales shall be advisable or beneficial to those interested
in this my Will. I give and bequeath to Messrs Adam Lupton
& William Deayton to Mr. M. Hull the partner of Mr. W. Broadfoot &
William Deayton (whom I hereby constitute my Executors) my
Servant George, requesting them to emancipate him, according
to Law, as he has promised to remain always with my children.
The negroes bequeathed to me & to my children by the Will of Mr.
John Parker deceased, are of course to go as has been directed in
that Instrument. All the rest residue and remainder of
my Estate real or personal or otherwise, in possession, remains
reversion or expectancy I give devise and bequeath to my
children as aforesaid in this City, to be equally divided among
them & their heirs & assigns forever, share & share alike: and should
any of them die before the age of twenty one or marriage I give
& devise his her or their share or shares, as the case may be to
what, he, she or they are entitled under this my Will, to be equally
divided among his, her or their surviving brothers or sisters, who
shall attain the age of twenty one or marry & his her or their heirs
and assigns forever. Witness my hand and seal at Charleston

any of them die before the age of twenty one or marriage I give
& devise his her or their share or shares, as the case may be to
what, he, she or they are entitled under this my Will, to be equally
