and the money arising thereupon to discharge all my just debts and
it is my Will and important request to my Executors that this man
Billy have libertie to choose his own master and the money arising
from his sale and other things that I appoint to be sold when my
few debts are fully discharged This remaining cash I give to my little
nephew Clements Brown Price son of William Price. Item I give
and bequeath ^{to my nephew} Benjamin Dubose three negroes, namely, Hannon,
Amanta and my little boy George, and should my nephew Clements
Brown Dubose arrive to the age of twenty years, I give and bequeath to
him the tract of land I now reside on together with the adjoining
Tract of one hundred and twenty one Acres and also three
negroes young Hannah and her two children Harry and Peggy and
their increase to him and his heirs and my Executors are authorized to hire
out this Land if they should suppose it best and the price to be for
the benefit of my nephew Clements Brown Dubose. But in case this my
nephew Clements B. Dubose should not arrive to the age of twenty years
leaving no child as his last wish is that the same should be

queath the two tracts of land above mentioned and the above named
three ~~young~~ ^{young} negroes, Hannah and her two children Harry and
Peggy to my nephew Samuel Dubose Son of Benjamin Dubose to him
and his heirs - I give to my sister Rebekah Dubose my Portmanteau
Trunk my wearing appanell, my family Bible and the use and
service of my negro boy Hector during her natural life. But at the
death of this my sister I give and bequeath this boy Hector to my ne-
phew William P. Brown Dubose to him and heirs and being desirous
that my woman Mary should obtain her freedom at my death
or as the debts of my Estate can be paid and proposing special
confidence in my friends William b. Shackelford and wife M^{rs}
Sarah Shackelford that they will ^{effect her} emancipation agreeable to my desire
I do will and bequeath this negro woman Mary to them my friends
William Shackelford Senr. and his wife M^{rs} Sarah Shackelford jointly
Item. I do will and bequeath to Susannah Evans wife of M^r John
Evans Senr. my negro girl Joann my riding chair and chair horse
Drednot to be at her own disposal I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Brown
Barnett my negro boy Isaac my mahogany Desk & two large looking glasses
I give to my cousin Sarah Whidden my mahogany Bed Boffett. - I give

to my nees Elizabeth B. Brown, all my books and lots of silver
spoons. I give to my free Boy Handy seven head of cattle and
my mare called Mouch with their increase. all the rest and
of my Estate not already mentioned I desire to be sold by my Executors
to help to pay my few debts these consisting of Household furniture
Bedding and some Stock and lastly I do by these presents constitute
and appoint my friends William C. Shackelford, Benjamin
Dubose and John Evans Senr. Executors to this my last Will and
Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and
Seal this second day of March and in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight Hundred and nineteen. Elizabeth Brown
