being of sound and disposing mind memory and judgment, but weak
and feeble in body, do make and ordain this to be my Last Will & Testament
First I commend my Soul into the Hands of my Heavenly Father hope-
ing for a participation of those joys promised to us thro' the mediation of
his Son Jesus Christ. Second as regards the worldly effects with which I
have been blessed I give and bequeath unto my Executors hereinafter
named and to the Survivors of them his Executors & administrators

466 the sum of one thousand dollars to be appropriated to be applied
to the discharge of my Funeral Expenses, to the Erection of such Tomb
stone or monument to my memory as they may think suitable and to
the procuring for the families of my friends Jacob Davis John Stro-
hecker John M. Hoff and Michael Kieckly with mourning. Third
I give devise and bequeath to the Religious Corporation known and
distinguished as the ~~German~~ Lutheran Church of German Protestants
in the City of Charleston and to their Successors and assigns forever my
Brick House and Lot in King Street in which I lately resided & known
at present by the number 276. also the sum of four thousand dollars to
form a part of the funds designated in the twelfth rule of the said
Church for "the indigent members and widows belonging to the Church".
Fourth, I give and bequeath to the City Council of Charleston in trust for
the Orphan House One thousand dollars. Fifth I give & bequeath
unto the German Friendly Society in Charleston the sum of one thou-
sand Dollars in aid of and to form a part of the fund designated
in their Rules and By-Laws as "The fund for the relief of distressed
transient Germans". Sixth I give and bequeath my negro man slave
named Buttes to Charles Strohecker son of John Strohecker and
to his heirs. Seventh I give and bequeath my negro Woman Slave named
Charlotte to Louisa Strohecker Daughter of John Strohecker and to her
heirs. Eighth I give and bequeath to my Executors herein after named

Charlotte to Louisa Strohucker Daughter of John Strohucker and to her heirs. Eighth I give and bequeath to my Executors hereinafter named and the Survivors of them, his Executors and administrators my negro Woman Slave named Jerry and her Daughter Peggy in Trust to the absolute use and behoof of Mary Elizabeth Hoff daughter of John W Hoff and to her heirs, but should the said Mary Elizabeth Hoff depart this life under the age of twenty one years and unmarried then in trust to the sole and Separate use of her Mother Nancy Hoff and her heirs. Ninth I give and bequeath unto my said Executors and the Survivors of them, his Executors and administrators my negro Girl Slave named Betty in trust to the absolute use and behoof of Cecilia Davis daughter of Jacob Davis and to her heirs, but should the said Cecilia Davis depart this life under the age of twenty one years and unmarried then in trust to the sole and Separate use of her Mother Mary Davis and her heirs. Tenth I give and bequeath unto my God-children Elizabeth Weisfinger, Elizabeth Boyer, Elizabeth Oppenheim, Elizabeth Miller, and Sarah Miller, two hundred dollars each, and Jane Kieckly and Caroline Kieckly each three hundred dollars. Eleventh I give and bequeath to Charles Payne the sum of one hundred dollars to be put out at interest by my Executors to accumulate and to be paid to him when he arrives at the age of twenty one years. Twelfth I give and bequeath unto my said Executors and to the

Survivor of them his Executors and administrators the sum of ~~Twenty~~ ^{Twenty} hundred and seventy five dollars in trust for Cecilia Davis the daughter of said Davis and her heirs, and to be vested in such stock or public security by my said Executors as they may deem most advantageous to her interest in order that the said sum may accumulate and to pay over and surrender the same to the said Cecilia Davis when she arrives to the age of twenty one years or day of marriage whichever may first happen. But should the said Cecilia Davis die under the age of twenty one years and unmarried then to hold the same in trust to the sole and separate use of her mother the said Mary Davis free from the Control of, and not to be liable to the debts or circumstances of her present or any future husband she may have and to her heirs. Thirteenth. I give and bequeath unto my said Executors and the Survivor of them his Executors and administrators the sum of Thirteen hundred and Seventy five dollars in trust for Mary Elizabeth Hoff daughter of John M Hoff and her heirs, and to be vested in such stock or public security by my said Executors as they may deem most advantageous to her interest in order that the said sum may accumulate and to pay over and surrender the same to the said Mary Elizabeth Hoff when she arrives to the age of twenty one years or day of marriage whichever may first happen. But should the said Mary Elizabeth Hoff die under the age of twenty one years and unmarried, then to hold the same in trust to the sole and separate use of her Mother the said Nancy Hoff her heirs and assigns.

Fifteenth I give and bequeath unto Michael Kieckly the Sum of Six hundred and Eighty Seven dollars and fifty cents in trust for his daughter Jane and to be vested in such Stock or public Security as the said Michael Kieckly may deem most advantageous to the interest of his said Daughter Jane in order that the said Sum may accumulate and to pay over or Surrender the same to her when she shall arrive at the age of

twenty one years or day of marriage which ever shall first happen
 also the further Sum of Six hundred and Eighty Seven dollars and fifty
 Cents in trust for his daughter Caroline and to be Vested in such Stock
 or public Security as the said Michael Keckly may deem most ad-
 vantageous to the interest of his said daughter Caroline in order that
 the said Sum may accumulate and to pay over or Surrender the same
 to her when she shall arrive at the age of twenty one years or day
 of marriage whichever shall first happen. Sixteenth I give & bequeath
 unto my said Executors and the Survivor of them his Executors and
 Administrators the Sum of one hundred dollars in trust for my Slave
 Benter, one hundred dollars in trust for my Slave Charlotte, One
 hundred ^{and fifty} dollars in trust for my Slave Sonny, and One hundred and
 fifty dollars in trust for my Slave Peggy to be Separately Vested in
 such Stock or public Security as my said Executors may deem advisable
 and the interest accruing on the several portions to be paid to the res-
 pective Slaves annually during Life. Whenever any of the said Slaves
 die, it is my Will and desire that the principal Sum Vested for
 the benefit of such Slave so dying should be given by my Executors &
 the Survivor of them his Executors and Administrators to such Charitable
 Society or Charitable Institution as they ^{who} may think proper. Seven-
