

126. In the Name of God Amen, I Elizabeth Marquis being
weak in body but in sound mind, do make this my last Will and
Testament in the manner following, first it is my will and desire my
Just and desire my Just and lawfull debts be paid also my desire
that my Negro fellow Stepmay be sold for the payment of the same
and the over plus be laid out for the good of my Estate, the remainder
I give the labour of my Negroes with the use of my household goods
to my beloved Husband Joseph Marquis for the maintaining him
and my two Children that is from the rise of what they may make
Yearly until my son Hugh Marquis comes to the Age of eighteen
then the whole of my Estate to be equally divided between my two
Children Catharine and Hugh's Marquis share and share equally
alike but in case of my daughters Intire marriage then for her to
have her share immediate but in case my Executors do think best not
to dispose of said Negro Stepmay I do give full power for the said Execu-
tors to do as they may think fit lastly I appoint Joseph Roger
and Abraham Riddlesparger to be my Executors to this my last
Will and Testament. May the 18. 1794.
