And lastly I commend myself to him who gave me being and who is the author of numerous blessings I have enjoyed through life trusting that my Conduct in this probationary State has been such as to secure to me his divine favour and Eternal Grace. Witness my hand this seventeenth 17th day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two.

called the oaks as removed and divided by Mr David Gaillard in conformity
to the last Will and Testament of my Father, with the household furniture
beds &c to him and his heirs forever. 3^d I give and bequeath to my Mother Mrs
H. Palmer my Plantation called Cole Bridge during the continuance of her partial
or permanent residence in Pine Hills, In case of her entire removal from the said
Village I give and bequeath the said Plantation to my Brother Sam^l J. Palmer
to him and his heirs forever. 4th to my friend Charles Stearns I give the acceptance
of my tract of Land (about one thousand acres) commonly called the Fountain
Run Tract to him and his heirs forever. 5th to my son Estuard John James
E. Stearns I request the acceptance of Three Hundred Dollars to purchase a gold
Watch or Double Panned Gun (as he may think proper) in token of my affection
