forever, to be equally divided between them share and share  
alike. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter

Charleston at my death. Item

Executors to sell and dispose of any part of my Estate real or  
personal at their discretion, tending to the general benefit of  
the legatees. Lastly I do hereby appoint my beloved children  
Mary Magdalen Rouffell & George Boon Rouffell & Frederick  
Fraser and Henry Alex<sup>r</sup>. Deshaupere Executors of this my last
