perfect understanding and memory do consti-
tute this my last Will and Testament, and de-
sire it may be received by all as such, as for
my burial I desire it may be decent, without
pomp or state, at the discretion of my dear
Children and Executors hereafter named, who
I doubt not will manage it with all requisite
prudence; And as to my worldly Estate I will
and bequeath and do positively give in man-
ner following, that is to say, to my daughter
Martha Esther Anderson, I will and bequeath
one Negro Man named Jacob. I will and bequeath

132 to my daughter Esther Singeltary two Negroes a
Wench named Patty and her Child married Anne
Inwill and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth
Anderson two negroes a Wench named Jenny
and a boy named June, Inwill and bequeath
to my daughter Judith Guerin, two negroes a
fellow named Daniel and a girl named Becky
Inwill and bequeath to my two Grand Sons Wil-
liam Sanders and John Sanders two Negro
Children a girl named Marian and a boy
named Neptune together with fifty pounds ster-
ling money in lieu of a Wench named Lener
who being old I thought proper to sell and leave
the fifty pounds in the hands of my Executor
to be kept in their hands until my two Grand
Sons arrive to the age of twenty one years,
then to be equally divided between them, but
should my two Grand Sons die before they
come to the age of twenty one years then the
two Negroes together with the fifty pounds shall
return to my four daughters and be equally
divided among them or their heirs, and as to
the rest of my Estate both real and personal
after my funeral expences and just debts be fully
discharged, I will and bequeath one fifth part to
my daughter Martha Esther Anderson, one
fifth part to my daughter Esther Singeltary,
one fifth part to my daughter Elizabeth An-
derson, one fifth part to my daughter Judith
Guerin, and one fifth part to my two Grand
Sons William Sanders and John Sanders.
Lastly I do make and constitute my two Sons
in law Joseph Singeltary and Daniel An-
derson Executors to this my last Will and
Testament, and trustees for my two Grand
Sons, hereby revoking all other Will in so far
