

## SOME ORIGINAL CHARLESTON PROBATE RECORDS

[Folder not numbered]: Moses, Henry

The Petition of Mrs. Elizabeth Moses, administratrix of all and singular the goods and credits of Henry Moses, late of Charleston, Store keeper, deceased, sheweth that there are sundry articles of household and Kitchen furniture, one hundred & eighty ounces silver, sundry articles of Dry Goods, one negro wench named Sophy named Adam. All of which it will be necessary to sell in order to pay the debts of the estate. Your Petitioner therefore prays for leave to sell the said articles as soon for the reason above assigned. Elizabeth Moses.

21st March 1813. Ordered that the administratrix do immediately advertise property to be sold the furniture, silver & dry goods at the residence of the dec'd the 13th day of March inst., and the negroes on Tuesday the 18th April at the residence of the dec'd on Monday the 13th day of March next, and the negroes on Friday the 18th day of April next. Terms cash.

Folder M-32: Moulin, Peter.

The Petition of Peter Fayolle and Louis Monnar qualified executors of the testament of Peter Moulin, late of Charleston, deceased, respectfully sheweth that there are three negroes, household and kitchen furniture, and a variety of other articles of personal property fully and at large appear reference being had to the Inventory and appraised same regularly executed and deposited for record in your office. That in order to comply with the directions of their testator, as contained in his Last Will and Testament duly proved and of record in your office, your petitioners are of opinion that it is necessary and proper and will conduct the interest of this estate that an inventory of that property of this estate to be made, further that in a considerable degree in regard to the negroes your Petitioners consider the property of a perishable nature liable to waste and injury. Your Petitioners therefore pray for leave to sell all the property of the estate on Monday the 21st of January instant at the late residence of the dec'd by Calvin Baker for the negroes  $\frac{1}{2}$  cash the rest for 12 months security.
