The Petition of Philip Naser administrator of all and singular the goods, rights and interests of Henry Naser, late of Charleston, Butcher, deceased, sheweth that the estate consists of three Horses, some household furniture and other articles which are perishable and your petitioner is desirous of selling as well for the purpose of paying the debts as preventing them from perishing. Philip Naser [signed in German]

June 25, 1794. Ordered that the admor do immediately advertise the above property to be sold at the Intestate's late place of residence in Beresford Street, on the sixteenth

George J. Broughton of Charleston Neck, Rope Maker, applied for administration of the estate of Ursule R. Nell, late of Charleston Neck, widow, deceased, in right of next of kin. Dated 3 July 1832. Published 7th, 9th, and 10th July in the Charleston Mercury.
