writing to be my last will and Testament hereby revoking
all others heretofore made. And I do hereby and herein
give devise bequeath all my Estate property & effects
whenever & wherever to be equally and fairly divided
to and between my three blood Mees Eliza Madison
Frances Baldwin and Eliza Baldwin her sister now
residing in or near Kilmington in the County of Norfolk
in the Kingdom of Great Britain to them & their Heirs for
ever have & share alike. and I do hereby authorize and
empower and direct my Executor George Coffin Esq
of Charleston, to sell and dispose of the same and every part
thereof either for Cash or on a short credit as he may
see most judicious taking security for the amount to be
paid; and to remit and forward on the proceeds
thereof to my said Mees above named respectively & I
do also hereby and herein nominate and appoint the
said George Coffin Esq

paid: and to remit and forward on the proceeds
thereof to my said ^{nieces} ~~daughters~~ above named respectively & I
do also hereby and herein nominate and appoint the
said George Coffin my sole Executor hereof and thereby
authorize him to close my concerns as early as possible
after my death. All my legal debts in case any should
appear, to be first settled. But as there are none at present
it is supposed none will appear. In witness whereof I
do hereby and herein put my hand and seal this first of

share in the Capital Stock of the South Carolina Bank.

Stock of the Bank of South Carolina Item I bequeath
to Eliza Hughes daughter of O E Hughes one share in
the Capital Stock of the Bank of South Carolina and
one old brooch Item I bequeath to my sister Mrs
Eliza Widdison my Gold watch Item I bequeath to
Miss Eliza Widdison my niece my Rose diamond breast
pin I also appoint Mr O E Hughes to act as one of
my Executors jointly with Geo M Coffin In Witness
whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal the third
day of February in the year four Lord Eighteen hundred
and forty six
