of what kind and quality soever the same may be,
(and not herein before given and disposed of after pay-
ment of my debts funeral expenses & legacy) to my
beloved wife Eugenie for her use and benefit, and for
the education Clothing and maintenance of my three
children Francis Eugene Frederick Yorley. and
Eugenie Margueritte as long as she remains my widow
