 do make & ordain this to be my last Will & Testament. I give & bequeath unto
 my Wife, Ann Mary Shively, All my Estate of every Description whatsoever
 & wheresoever upon the following trust, first to pay & satisfy all my legal &
 just debts, in any manner she may think proper, either by sale or other-
 wise of my said Estate. The rest & residue left after the pay^t of my said
 Debts, I bequeath unto my said Wife during her life, free from the im-
 peachment of waste, & after her death I bequeath the same unto my two Sons
 John Shively & Charles Shively share & share alike or such one of them as
 may be alive at the time of the death of my said Wife. But should neither
 of them survive their said Mother it is then my desire that the same should
 vest absolutely in her & to her sole & separate use. I nominate, constitute & appo-
 -int my said Wife Ann Mary Shively, Executrix of this my last Will & Tes-
 tament, revoking all others, heretofore made by me. Charleston 4 August 1818.
