ever. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved

ed Billy, and upon her complying with the
conditions hereafter to be named to her and the
heirs of her body for ever and in case she should
die without Issue the said Billy to revert back
to heirs at law. Item it is my Will and desire
that all the residue of my property of what ever
kind or description be sold at public auction
for cash and my out standing book debts collec
ted to raise a sum equal to the valuation of the
above named Negroes Neptune and Billy the
sums thus to be raised I give and bequeath to
my beloved brothers William and Philip Dubert
share and share alike to them and their heirs
for ever. NB. the conditions of my first and second

17 devise devise to Frederic Dubert and M^{rs} Schroter
are that if the sale of the rest of my property to-
gether with the money I may die possessed of,
should not raise a sum equal to the valuation
of Neptune and Billy in that case they shall
pay the deficiency to William and Philip Du-
bert so that they may all have share and
share alike, and should they not comply with
these conditions, the said Negroes to be sold for
cash, to make a fair and equal division between
Frederic Dubert, Elizabeth Schroter, William
Dubert and Philip Dubert. Item I give
and bequeath to my Sister Catharina
Groe fifteen pounds to be paid out of the mo-
ney of which I may be possessed at my de-
cease. And lastly I nominate constitute and
and appoint my friend the Reverend Philip
Mathews Executor to this my last Will and
Testament hereby revoking all other Wills and
Testaments by me at any time made, I Witness
whereof I have I have hereunto placed my
seal and signed my name this third day of
February in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and one and in the twenty fifth
year of American Independence.
