I William Cooke of the State & City aforesaid being in perfect health and of sound memory (blessed be God) but mindful of my frailty and the certainty of mortality and in discharge of what I consider a sacred duty to my family have on this sixth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty in the City of Charleston and State aforesaid made and published this my only and last Will and Testament in manner and form following, to wit: First I give to my wife Eliza
