In the Name of God Amen 17 R8 I Hamilton Hart of St James Goose Creek Parish, N9 35 Charleston District and State aforesaid Flanter being Sick and Weak in body but of sound and disposing Mind memory and understanding thanks be to God for the Same do make this my Last Will and testament in manner and form following that is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it, and my Body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian like manner, and touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to blefs me with in this Life, I give devise & dispose of the same in the following manner and form following; First that I all my lawful debts be paid by a Sale of such property as my Executrix & Executor hereafter appointed a think can be best Spair'd either rail or personal 2ndly I give devise and bequeath unto/beloved Wife Rebecka Hart the plantation and tract of land whereon I now live, during her natural Life, and then to be equally divided as the rest of my property. 3rdly I give and bequeath unto my Son William the Rone horse lately purchased, that he now claims. 4thly I give devise and bequeath to my beloved Wife Rebecka Hart and my beloved Children William, Emily Clayton, Harriet, Rachel, Middleton, and Caroline Rose Ann Mart, all/my Estate both rail & personal that is not already disposed off whatsoever and Wheresoever it may be found to be equally divided between them to share and Share alike by an appraisement of five disinterested free holders to be chosen by my Executrix and Executor as my children become of age or marry, five freeholders shall be chosen as aforesaid and they on their oath Shall divide the property into as many lots as there is hairs and draw Lot, and Lots undrawn to be put together again

and Kept together as though such lots had never been made and that is the way that I wish pursued at every division, the undivided property to be Kept together by my Executrix and Executor and the income or interest thereof for the raising and educating of the said minor children & also for the support of my wife Rebeckan, it is to be understood that my Will is, that divisions of the Lands is to be made at the same time and in the same manner as the personal property. 5thly and should it please almighty God to blefs me with more children it is my Will and desire that they should share equally with those aforementioned in every respect, and I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Rebecka Hart and my son William Hart my Executrix & Executor to this my Last Will & testament disannulling all former wills and bequeath by me made, owning this & this only to be my Last.
